To materials it need to add an application with indicating the topics, information about the author (name, surname, patronymic, scientific degree, rank, position and place of work), and contact information.

The publication of the materials of the conference is foreseen in the professional journal on the theology "Works of KTA" and in a separate collection.

Travel, accommodation and meals are at the expense of conference participants.

Articles are accepted in the following languages: Ukrainian, Crimean Tatar, English, Polish, Belarusian, Czech, Slovak, Bulgarian, Serbian, Croatian and Macedonian.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ARTICLES

1. The text of the article should have the following elements:

- 1) The problem is presented in general terms and its connection with important scientific or practical tasks.
- 2) An analysis of recent researches and publications, which initiated the solution of this problem, which is based on the author; selection previously unsettled parts of the general issue, which is devoted to the article.
- 3) Formulating the purpose of the article (problem statement).
- 4) Presentation of the main research material with full justification of the received scientific results.
- 5) Conclusions from this study and prospects for further exploration in this direction.

2. Formatting the text of the article:

- The text of the article should be typed in the **Microsoft Word** processor, pages should be without hyphenation and footers, there should be alignment in width. The dash (–) and the hyphen (-) should be clearly differentiated. The initials and surname must be written in an indissoluble space;

- **Volume of the article should be 7–12 pages (with bibliography);**

- Font should be **Times New Roman**, 14 pt;

- Line spacing is 1,5, paragraph – 1,25;

- Page parameters: upper and lower field – 2 cm, left – 2.5 cm, right – 1.5 cm;

- In the first line to the left there is the UDC index;

- In the next line to the right there is **a san, first and surname or initials and surname** (bold type);

- Through the line there should be the **TITLE OF THE ARTICLE** of the capitalized bold type in the center;

- Through the line from the paragraph there should be *the summary* (italics, not bold);

- In the next line of the paragraph there should be **Keywords:** (not italic, highlight bold), keyword list (italics, not bold);

- Through the line there should be the text of the article;

- Through the line **a list of sources and literature** (these words do not write) should be executed in alphabetical order in accordance with the requirements in force.

Example:

Book: *Lototsky O. Autocephaly*. – K., 1999. – Vol. 1. – 206 p.

Article: *Metropolitan Epiphanius (Dumenko)*. The role of the Kyiv Academy in the history and the present // *The Orthodox in Ukraine: Collection of materials of the V International Scientific Conference*. – K., 2015. – P. 14–21.

- Links for literature should be made in the form of square brackets, where the first number is a serial number in the list of sources and literature and the second is the page number – [5, p. 346];

- Through the line on the left there is **a san, first and surname or initials and surname** in Ukrainian (bold, not italic);

- In the next line on the center there should be the **TITLE OF THE ARTICLE** in Ukrainian (capitalized bold);

- Through the line from the paragraph there should be the text of the summary in Ukrainian (italics, not bold);

- In the next line of the paragraph there should be **Key words:** the list of keywords in Ukrainian (italics, not bold);

- If the article has illustrations, they should be submitted electronically with a resolution of at least 300 dpi.

3. The text and accompanying materials should be edited and verified, and surnames and other proper names, as well as terms should be verified and unified. It is desirable to avoid abbreviations, and if there is such a need to decrypt them. The editorial board is not responsible for the scientific content of the articles and the errors committed by the authors. The editorial board reserves the right to reject materials with expressive editorial and stylistic flaws and those received later than an established term.

4. The control copy of the file should be submitted in one copy.

5. The authors without a scientific degree submit a review on the article of the Doctor of Science or Philosophy Doctor.
